GENERAL SESSION

This year the **General Session** will be held on Friday morning at 8:00 am and will include the scholarship announcements, new member report, ASTA report and **Keynote Speaker**, **Dr. Jay Lehr**. Dr. Lehr makes people feel good about North American Agriculture. He is a powerful, entertaining speaker who combines a deep understanding of science, policy and economics in describing the impact of advancing technologies on the local, regional, national, and global economy. GOLF TOURNAMENT

Golf Chairman Melvin Aoki has planned a wonderful tournament at Kaanapali Golf Course. The Resort South Course was originally created as an executive course and was later redesigned by architect Arthur Jack

Snyder in 1976. At 6,600 yards, the Par 71 course is a more forgiving golf course with subtle, undulating greens that accomodates all levels of play. The land which Kaanapali Golf Courses was founded, originally housed a sugar cane plantation. Players will see the Sugar Cane Train steam past several holes on the course (now used for tours) and are reminded of Hawaii's rich culture and history. Along many holes on the Resort course lie natural canals, gulches and lava rock boundaries. The course is landscaped with native flowers along the trails like the hibiscus, bougainvillea and plumeria, as well as the Norfolk Pines and coconut trees that border many fairways. These features are part of what makes the course most enjoyable. The tournament will be a modified shot-gun beginning at 1:00 sharp on Thursday!













THE SPECTACULAR ULALENA SHOW

Maui Theatre Presents 'Ulalena, a theatrical experience as impressive as the story. It employs the talents of some of Hawaii's most distinguished musicians and performers, combining live traditional



Hawaiian music with 8-channel surround sound. Every seat maintains a sense of intimacy and interaction with the performance. Traditional Butoh theatre is blended with acrobatic feats of strength and beauty. Hula is combined with modern dance. DEEP SEA FISHING

Interested folks can grab a reel and catch the big one! Six-hour private deep sea fishing charter on the waters off Maui. Sport fish include Mahi (Dorado), Ahi (Yellow Fin Tuna) and Marlin. The boats will depart the hotel bright and early -5:15 am on Thursday, April 20th and



return at 12:00 noon. Tour includes chartered boat, coordination and advance staffing, captain and crew gratuities, cooler with ice, all fishing rods, reels and bait and harbor fee.

AGRICULTURAL TOUR

Join us Friday afternoon as we tour Monsanto's Kihei Foundation Seed Breeding Facility and the Hawaiin Cane & Sugar Plant. This tour will have two stops; first we will tour one of Monsanto's farm stations on Maui. This agricultural research station play an important role in developing new varieties of seed crops that help to reduce pesticide use, preserve our environment, help farmers around the world succeed, fight insects and diseases, and improve the nutritional quality of our foods. Next stop, the Hawaii Cane & Sugar Plantation. Hawaii's is the largest producer of raw sugar. Come and tour how they grow sugarcane on the Maui plantation and process the cane in two historic mills.

WEST MAUI SNORKEL EXCURSION

Four hours on the water as you explore the Westside of Maui in clear and unspoiled water. Watch for whales and sea turtles! This catamaran trip will leave the hotel at 1:30 pm Saturday afternoon and will include captain and crew, snorkel gear and instruction, crew gratuity and harbor fees. The tour will return to the hotel at 5:30 pm. Wear swimsuit & light cover-up, bring towels, sunscreen and a camera!!
